REFORMATION: Grace, Faith, Scripture

As we continue to celebrate the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation, we center our worship on faith. By faith we believe the teachings the Reformation restored; and by faith we live those blessings daily.

One of the hymns we will sing, “Our Father, who from Heaven Above,” was written and composed by Martin Luther. This hymn sings us through the Lord’s Prayer and helps serve as our guide to live a life of faith.

CONFESSION OF SINS

P: We have come into the presence of God, who created us to love and serve him as his dear children. But we have disobeyed him and deserve only his wrath and punishment. Therefore, let us confess our sins to him and plead for his mercy.

Pause for silence

ALL: Merciful Father in heaven, I am altogether sinful from birth. In countless ways I have sinned against you and do not deserve to be called your child. But trusting in Jesus, my Savior, I pray: Have mercy on me according to your unfailing love. Cleanse me from my sin, and take away my guilt.

P: God, our heavenly Father, has forgiven all your sins. By the perfect life and innocent death of our Lord Jesus Christ, he has removed your guilt forever. You are his own dear child. May God give you strength to live according to his will.

C: Amen.

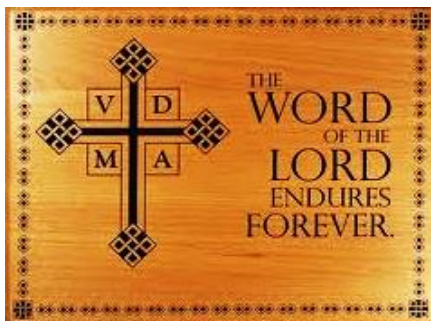
HYMN – "Our Father, Who from Heaven Above"

**C: By grace alone you formed us to be yours;
by grace alone you called us to be yours;
by grace alone you made us kings and priests to serve you forever.**

P: O merciful Son,

We who call ourselves Lutheran Christians are honored to bear your name. We have come here to praise you for giving yourself for us. You gave up your heavenly glory to live our lives for us; you gave your precious life to take our curse; you still give yourself to us in Holy Communion. Through your guidance Dr. Luther taught us to despair of our own good works and simply to accept your marvelous gifts in faith.

**C: By faith alone we are forgiven;
by faith alone we have the promise of your daily care;
by faith alone we have the hope of everlasting life.**

P: O Holy Spirit,

We who call ourselves Evangelical Lutheran Christians are honored to have your Gospel, your pure Gospel. We have come here to praise you for inspiring holy writers with your sacred thoughts and words. Through your guidance Dr. Luther taught us to despair of man-made authority and traditions, the arrogance of human reason and the whims of personal experience, and to rely solely on the Scripture.

**C: By Scripture alone we are informed of your mighty works;
by Scripture alone we are persuaded to believe you;
by Scripture alone we test all religious teaching, thought and opinion. Amen.**

LORD'S PRAYER

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen.
